The CAP Solar Eclipse Mission was one of the largest in Civil Air Patrol history. Over the course of 6.5 hours, over 3,400 CAP members and 34,000 AEM classroom participants in all 52 wings worked together to capture the effect of a solar eclipse on weather and VHF radio communications. Come learn about the 5-year planning process it took to create a mission of this scale, hear about the scientific discoveries made with the data CAP members collected, and be the first to hear the details of the next CAP/NASA Citizen Science Mission!

Cadet-to-cadet abuse presents a unique context in which traditional abuse prevention strategies fall short, and distinguishing inappropriate versus harmful behaviors may be difficult. This session will highlight current trends and challenges related to cadet-to-cadet abuse situations, paired with key considerations from evidence-based prevention practices and strategies. Practical implementation strategies will be discussed through a series of contextual examples. This session will integrate the knowledge and passion already reflected in our communities with evidence-based practices, as we work towards a common goal: transforming youth and serving communities.

Operation Pulse-Lift – CAP's Largest/Longest Humanitarian Mission

Operation Pulse Lift is Civil Air Patrol's largest and longest on-going Emergency Services mission since World War II and the organization's largest humanitarian mission in its 82-year history. Eight times more lives have been saved by Civil Air Patrol's Blood Donor Center events, individual member blood donations, and blood transports than all other combined missions in Civil Air Patrol and First Air Force's history. Operating from 60 locations across the nation (including Alaska and Hawaii) and overseas, over 5,000 members have both personified and operationalized Civil Air Patrol's mission of "Serving America's Communities, Saving (over 100,000) Lives, and Shaping Futures. It is Civil Air Patrol's "All-America" mission - whose motto says it all, "And the beat goes on."

Professional Development in Emergency Services – Certified Emergency Manager (Qualifies for ES credit)

Since 1 December 1941, CAP became the fifth member of the White House - Office of Emergency Management, it has led the nation; now the oldest Emergency Management organization in the United States. This has not been shown more than its affiliation and certification support to the International Association of Emergency Managers (IAEM).
