
Help Keep the WWI Legacy Alive!

The Commemorative Air Force has signed up to be a part of the **70th anniversary of the end of World War II** participating in a **nationwide flyover of WWII aircraft in communities throughout America starting on Friday the 14**th **and going thru Sunday the 16**th. The goal of the mass flyover is to pay tribute to the pivotal role American airpower played during WWII and to remind the public of the importance of preserving the last remaining planes of the era so they can continue to educate and inspire future generations, to include our CAP cadets.



If you have access to an airplane, please consider scheduling on the website to fly on one or more of the days. "Getting the airplanes in the air" will help the "Spirit of 45" organization maximize publicity and remembrance around the nation. This is an opportunity to engage your community on a larger scale with a significant patriotic event.

This effort is much larger than just the flyovers and airplanes and includes organizations focused on every mission of all of the services and started in 2010. Congress voted unanimously in favor of observing a **National Spirit of '45 Day** on the **second Sunday of every August**, coinciding with the anniversary of August 11, 1945, the historic day when President Harry S. Truman announced that World War II was over. This was a significant shot in the arm for the folks who founded "Keep the Spirit of '45 Alive!" It is a nationwide, grassroots, nonprofit initiative to establish an annual day to honor the achievements of what is often referred to as America's 'greatest generation' so that their example of courage, self-sacrifice, service and national unity will forever inspire future generations of Americans – especially our youth.
